Please find enclosed Further Environmental Information (FEI) to support an application for consent under Section 36 of the Electricity Act 1989 and for deemed planning permission under Section 57 of the Town and Country Planning (Scotland) Act 1997 for the construction and operation of the Cruach Clenamacrie Wind Farm including battery storage and associated infrastructure with an expected operational life of up to 50 years (the 'Proposed Development').

The Proposed Development would have a maximum installed capacity of up to 65MW, comprised of six turbines with a tip height of up to 200m and an installed generating capacity of up to 45MW and a battery storage capacity of up to 20MW.

The Proposed Development is located approximately 7km to the east of Oban within Argyll and Bute. The location and layout of the Proposed Development can be seen on **Figure 3.6** and **Figure 3.7** respectively of **FEI Volume 2**.

Green Cat Renewables Ltd (GCR) are acting as the agent and lead consultant for this application and hereby submits the FEI to the Scottish Ministers on behalf of Voltalia UK Ltd (the Applicant).

## **Further Environmental Information**

FEI has been prepared by the Applicant which includes revisions to the internal access tracks and provides response to a number of consultees. The FEI addresses the holding objection from the Scottish Environment Protection Agency (SEPA) and comments from Ironside Farrar, it also addresses requests from Argyll and Bute Council (ABC) in relation to cumulative Landscape and Visual and Noise and provides response to comments from NatureScot.

The FEI provides updates to the following EIA topics: Landscape and Visual, Cultural Heritage and Archaeology, Noise, Hydrology, Ecology, Ornithology and Carbon Balance. The remaining topic areas do not require further assessment as a result of the infrastructure updates or the comments from SEPA, ABC or NatureScot.
